Colby's formal training!

At ten months old, Colby has officially begun his formal training! Since his birth, Colby's trainers have spent countless hours striving to make all of their interactions with him very positive. These interactions were all part of his informal training. Colby is now consistently eating about 7 pounds of capelin and herring every day, which means his formal training is underway!



The first step in Colby's formal training was learning to recognize and respond to his name. This was no problem for Colby as he mastered this skill in a matter of days! The focus of his training now is learning to target. To target simply means to touch. This behavior is the foundation for the training for all of our flippered friends. Each animal learns to target, or touch, their nose or any other body part to a target pole or a trainer's hand. Using this target, the trainers are able to guide the animal step by step through each behavior we want them to learn. Colby is currently learning to patiently touch the target with his mouth closed. Before long, Colby will be holding

his nose to the target and following it to learn simple behaviors such as laying down which we call "sleep". Colby's trainers are thrilled with his progress. It looks like

The *Animal Training Camp* for 10-12 year olds and the *Animal Behavior Camp* offered to 7-9 year olds are back this summer offering junior trainers an in-depth experience to learn more about our flippered friends. In addition to these action-packed camps, we are also offering a variety of new camps this summer season!

For those who really want to do their part to protect our Earth, check out these brand new ocean conservation camps. *Ocean Ambassadors* is a 2-day camp for 7-9 year olds focused on learning about the ocean and environmental issues. Campers will explore ocean animals and identify simple steps to help keep our oceans clean and blue. 10-12 year olds can become *Ocean*

Stewards in our 2-day camp that covers environmental conservation topics with an emphasis on taking personal action to protect the earth.

Sea Lion Pups in Need


This year is proving to be a struggle for California sea lion pups out in the wild. From January 1st to March 31st of this year, over 1,100 pups have stranded themselves along the California coast spanning from Santa Barbara to San Diego. This number is seven times more than it was during the same period of last year.

Stranding centers, such as the Marine Mammal Center in Sausalito, CA. are taking in as many pups as possible in hopes of rehabilitating them and releasing them back to the wild. The pups are coming into the centers extremely dehydrated, malnourished and most of them are extremely underweight for their age. The rescue centers are working around the clock to hydrate these animals and get them to the point where they are eating fish on their own. Once a pup has gained enough weight and appears to have no other medical conditions, it is released

back to the ocean.







Due to this dangerously high number of strandings, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has officially declared an Unusual Mortality Event (UME). The Maine Mammal Protection Act, established in 1972, states that a UME is "a stranding that is unexpected; involves a significant die-off of any marine mammal population; and demands immediate response." Due to the increasing amounts of UMEs over the past several years, efforts to study carcasses and live stranded animals have increased dramatically. Through studying these strandings, researchers and facilities are able to gain a better understanding of pollution threats and stressors, as well as over all ocean health.



The UME allows for a team of investigators to come together and extra funding to be provided in order to hopefully determine the cause. Until now, only speculations have been made as to the reason for these strandings. One hypothesis is that the supply of

anchovies and sardines, small fish that are essential to the sea lions diet, is very limited, which results in mothers not being able to sufficiently nurse their young. Infectious diseases and ocean pollutants are also thought to potentially contribute to these numerous strandings.



The Alliance of Marine Mammal
Parks and Aquariums (AMMPA) is coordinating a
support system of accredited facilities for the current
UME and future UMEs. AMMPA is developing the
ability to be a resource of communities the are able
to react and respond to UMEs in order to assist with
animal rescue, rehabilitation, release, and research
when the need arises.
